Dick was born in 1923 to Reka and Henry Vredeveld in Fremont, Michigan — one of nine children. He proudly served in the U.S. Army during World War II, stationed throughout Europe. He carried that same loyalty and discipline into his 40-year career with Gerber Products Company, in Fremont and Three Oaks. Retirement gave him new opportunities to explore life — traveling to the Holy Land, earning a 4.0 in the one college class he took, winning the Baldwin Street CRC Chili Cook-off, and squeezing his own orange juice.

His four children — Barbara (and Peter) Wagenmaker, Janet (and Kendall) Weiden, Gordon Vredeveld, and Karin Vredeveld — are grateful for his Christian example, his gentle sense of humor, his almost-daily fresh-baked muffins, and his snippets of song that would pop up at predictable points in any given conversation.

Grandchildren Brian and Jeanette Weiden, Curtis and Sarah Weiden, Jason Wagenmaker, and Jennifer Wagenmaker will also miss their grandfather's attendance at concerts, sporting events, and church programs, as well as his genuine interest in their lives, careers, and growing families, including great-grandchildren Noah Weiden and Kendall Weiden.
